A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Safety and Consumer Protection of Nicotine Vapor
- 2 Products; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Georgia has a rich and robust nicotine vapor product industry; and

WHEREAS, electronic cigarettes, e-liquids, and other nicotine vapor products are currently
available for purchase in this state; and

6 WHEREAS, within the nicotine vapor product industry there is no current directory of
7 products that have been vetted and approved by the Food and Drug Administration for
8 consumer safety and consumption; and

9 WHEREAS, further study needs to be had on the consumer safety of refillable liquid vapor
10 products that are produced from the small businesses within the nicotine vapor product
11 industry; and

WHEREAS, until such products from small business manufacturers are adequately regulatedby the federal government, it is important to study all of the issues surrounding electronic

- 14 cigarettes, e-liquids, and other nicotine vapor products while at the same time encouraging
- 15 economic development in this state; and

16 WHEREAS, a study is needed to develop potential legislation or other action that would help 17 prevent incidents leading to consumer harm or injuries in the nicotine vapor industry and 18 protect the health and safety of those consuming the products.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

(1) Creation of House study committee. There is created the House Study Committee
 on Safety and Consumer Protection of Nicotine Vapor Products.

(2) Members and officers. The committee shall be composed of five members of the
 House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the committee as chairperson
 of the committee.

(3) Powers and duties. The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
 legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.

(4) Meetings. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

(5) Allowances and funding. The legislative members of the committee shall receive
the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia
Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any
member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized.
Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
appropriated to the House of Representatives.

39	(6) Report.
40	(A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
41	include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
42	same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
43	subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
44	(B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
45	proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
46	of this paragraph.
47	(C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
48	abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
49	A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
50	the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
51	(D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the
52	House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu
53	thereof.
54	(7) Abolishment. The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2024.
