A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the House Study Committee on Assessing the Semester and Quarter Systems at

2 USG and TCSG Institutions; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, institutions of the University System of Georgia (USG) have operated on the
semester system rather than the quarter system since 1999; and

5 WHEREAS, institutions of the Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) have operated
6 on the semester system rather than the quarter system since 2011; and

WHEREAS, with the conversion from the quarter system to the semester system, certain
benefits were anticipated. Among these were alignment of curricula within and across
systems to facilitate transfer of courses, increased administrative efficiencies, and reduced
administrative costs; and

WHEREAS, because the conversion from the quarter system to the semester system has resulted in longer terms with more classes and fewer graduation cycles, some question whether semesters are the better option for students or for workforce development; and WHEREAS, a study would be beneficial to examine respective advantages and disadvantages of semesters and quarters for institutions of the University System of Georgia and the Technical College System of Georgia and whether the anticipated benefits of converting to the semester system have been realized.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

(1) Creation of House study committee. There is created the House Study Committee
 on Assessing the Semester and Quarter Systems at USG and TCSG Institutions.

(2) Members and officers. The committee shall be composed of seven members asfollows:

(A) Five members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of
 the House of Representatives, at least one of whom shall be from the minority caucus;

- 25 (B) The chancellor of the University System of Georgia, or his designee; and
- (C) The commissioner of the Technical College System of Georgia, or his designee.
 The Speaker shall designate a legislative member of the committee as chairperson of the
 committee.
- (3) Powers and duties. The committee shall undertake to study the conditions, needs,
 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
 legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- (4) Meetings. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
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(5) Allowances, expenses, and funding.

37 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
38 for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.

- (B) Members of the committee who are state officials, other than legislative members,
 or state employees shall receive no compensation for their services on the committee,
 but they may be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the performance of their
 duties as members of the committee in the same manner as they are reimbursed for
 expenses in their capacities as state officials or employees.
- 44 (C) The allowances and expenses authorized by this resolution shall not be received 45 by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are 46 authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come 47 from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives; except that funds for the 48 reimbursement of the expenses of state officials, other than legislative members, and 49 state employees shall come from funds appropriated to or otherwise available to their 50 respective agencies.

(6) **Report.**

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- (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
 include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
 same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
 subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
 proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
 of this paragraph.
- (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
 the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the
 House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu
 thereof.

66 (7) Abolishment. The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2024.
