## A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the House Study Committee on the Effects of the One Big Beautiful Bill Act  
2 (H.R. 1); and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, the federal budget legislation known as the One Big Beautiful Bill Act (H.R. 1),  
4 enacted on July 4, 2025, includes significant reductions and structural changes to federal  
5 spending that directly affect the flow of federal funds to states, including support for  
6 healthcare, education, housing, and infrastructure programs; and

7 WHEREAS, Georgia relies on federal funding as a critical component of its overall budget,  
8 and reductions in federal support will place increased pressure on the state's general fund,  
9 requiring greater state investment to maintain essential services and avoid shifting costs onto  
10 local governments, families, and working people; and

11 WHEREAS, in light of these federal budget reductions and changes, the General Assembly  
12 must consider the long-term fiscal outlook of the state when enacting legislation, prioritizing  
13 responsible budgeting, protecting core public services, and ensuring that state policies do not  
14 exacerbate the impacts of federal disinvestment relative to students, seniors, and vulnerable  
15 communities.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

17 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee  
18 on the Effects of the One Big Beautiful Bill Act (H.R. 1).

19 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of seven members, five  
20 of whom shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and two shall  
21 be appointed by the state auditor. The Speaker shall designate a member of the  
22 committee as chairperson of the committee.

23 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,  
24 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or  
25 legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.

26 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee  
27 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or  
28 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and  
29 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

30 (5) **Allowances and funding.** The legislative members of the committee shall receive  
31 the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia  
32 Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any  
33 member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized.  
34 Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds  
35 appropriated to the House of Representatives.

36 (6) **Report.**

37 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that  
38 include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the  
39 same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to  
40 subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

41 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for  
42 proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)  
43 of this paragraph.

44 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of  
45 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.  
46 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with  
47 the Clerk of the House of Representatives.

48 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the  
49 House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu  
50 thereof.

51 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2026.
