Senator Doug Stoner, a Democrat, is a member of the State Institutions and Property, Retirement, Special Judiciary, and Regulated Industries and Utilities Committees.

Doug Stoner is a lifelong resident of the 6th Senate District and is a third-generation South Cobb business owner, operating the family business at the Dairy Queen in Smyrna. He graduated from Campbell High School and Kennesaw State University.

He and his wife Della are raising their two children, Gray and Honor, in his home community of South Cobb.

He is a former chair of the Cobb Transit Advisory Board and a member of the Smyrna Downtown Development Authority. He is past president of the King Springs School PTA and an active member of the Smyrna Business Association, Smyrna First United Methodist Church and the Cobb United Way Cabinet. His business, the Dairy Queen, supports many community and youth programs, including sponsorship of Little League teams.

On the development authority, Stoner succeeded in bringing economic progress and good job opportunities to the community without compromising quality of life. Sen. Stoner was elected to the Georgia House of Representatives in 2002, and the American Cancer Society and the Georgia Alliance for Tobacco Prevention honored him for his legislative leadership for both the 2003 and 2004 legislative sessions.
