

Senator Mike Dugan Senate District 30

Senator Mike Dugan, A Republican, was elected to the State Senate for Georgia's 30th District in 2013. The district he represents includes portions of Carroll, Douglas, Haralson, and Paulding counties.

Senator Dugan serves as Chairman of the Senate Committee on Veterans, Military, and Homeland Security and Vice Chairman of the Senate Committee on Economic Development and Tourism. In addition, he is a member of the Senate committee of Appropriations, Rules, and Ex Officio of the Senate Committee on Public Safety.

In 2018 Senator Dugan was elected by his colleagues to serve as Majority Leader and was voted as Legislator of the year. Senator Dugan previously served as Governor's Floor Leader and Chairman of the Senate Economic Development and Tourism Committee.

Senator Dugan is a graduate of Bowdon High School. As an active student he played football and ran track. He also graduated from the University of West Georgia (UWG). He earned a Master's Degree in Organizational Development, Bachelor's Degree in History, and a Harvard Kennedy School Executive Certificate in Public Policy.

After graduating from college, Senator Dugan enlisted in the United States Army. He was later commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Infantry. He became an Army Ranger and a Master Paratrooper. Senator Dugan is proud to have spent more than 20 years in the Army before retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel in 2008. During his career, he was deployed to more than 32 countries, including hostile fire deployments in Bosnia, Iraq and Afghanistan.

As a community leader, Senator Dugan has served as President of Carrollton Kiwanis Club.

He was also an Executive Board member for Carrollton Housing Authority and West Georgia Athletic Foundation. Senator Dugan is a local contractor at the Carrollton branch Ralin Construction. Ralin maintains a reputation as one of the most respected providers of construction services in the Southeast.

He is married to Missy and they have two adult children; daughter, Meghan and son, Beau. Sen. Dugan is a member of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Catholic Church in Carrollton.
