



**Rep. Chris Erwin
District 32**

Biography

Representative Chris Erwin is currently serving his eighth term in the Georgia House of Representatives, where he represents House District 32. He presently serves as Chairman of the House Education Committee.

In addition to chairing Education, Rep. Erwin serves on several key standing committees, including Appropriations, Insurance, Intragovernmental Coordination, Retirement, Rules and State Planning & Community Affairs, reflecting both the range of his policy expertise and the trust placed in him by House leadership.

Before entering elected office, Rep. Erwin built a distinguished career in public education. He retired after 10 years as Superintendent of the Banks County School System and previously served as a school administrator in Carroll County and Henry County. He is a former president of the Georgia School Superintendents Association and has served on the executive board of the American Association of School Administrators, as well as the board of the Georgia Association of Educational Leaders.

Rep. Erwin's leadership in education has been recognized repeatedly at the state level. He was named Georgia Superintendent of the Year by the Georgia School Boards Association in both 2012 and 2013, after previously being a finalist for the award in multiple years. In 2022, he received the Aileen Magill Ward Award from the Georgia Association of Educational Leaders, honoring his sustained contributions to public education leadership. In 2024, he was recognized with the Charter Champion Award by the Freedom Coalition, and in 2025, he was named to the Legislative Honor Roll by the Georgia Association of Educators, acknowledging legislators who demonstrated exceptional dedication to public education and educators during the 2025 legislative session.

Beyond the Capitol, Rep. Erwin has maintained a strong record of civic engagement, having previously served as president of the Banks County Chamber of Commerce, the Banks County Rotary Club, and as vice-chair of the Banks County Board of Health. His service to the community earned him the distinction of Banks County Citizen of the Year in 2006.

Rep. Erwin is a graduate of the University of Georgia, where he earned his Bachelor of Science degree, and holds advanced degrees from Georgia State University and the University of West Georgia. He is also a former Director of Business Development for Carroll Daniel Construction Company.

Through his long tenure, committee leadership and education-centered legislative focus, Rep. Erwin has established himself as one of the General Assembly's most influential voices on education policy and state governance.
