Under his leadership, Atlanta Public Schools achieved record-breaking graduation rates, redirected funding to classrooms instead of administration, and provided over \$100 million in staff pay increases and stipends.

As an entrepreneur and small business owner, he has firsthand experience with the challenges of rising costs and the need for livable wages. In the Georgia State Capitol, Jason uses his expertise as a litigation attorney, former corporate executive, and entrepreneur to advocate for policies that help Georgia businesses grow, ensure workers can support their families, and strengthen the state's economy.

Jason is deeply committed to service beyond the legislature. He serves on the boards of the Children's Museum of Atlanta, the World Affairs Council, and the Atlanta Volunteer Lawyers Foundation—organizations that reflect his passion for supporting children, families, and justice. He is also an active member of the 100 Black Men of Atlanta and Leadership Atlanta, where he works with leaders of the past, present, and future.
