With more than 20 years of project management and business analysis experience, she has been responsible for budgeting millions of dollars for Fortune 500 companies. She currently utilizes her expertise as a business analyst for the Marine Corps Logistics Base.

Active in public service, CaMia is past president of the Albany Chapter of Jack & Jill of America, Inc. and currently serves as legislative chair. She is the immediate past chair of the Regional Legislative Committee of the Southeastern Region of the Jack & Jill of America, Inc. and the National Legislative Committee of Jack & Jill of America, Inc.

CaMia is also a long-term community volunteer and is the immediate past chair of Flint River Habitat for Humanity Board of Directors and currently serves or has served on various other boards, including Leadership Albany, the Downtown Development Authority and the Dougherty County School System's Local School Governance Team. As a servant leader, she has organized community clean-up drives, holiday thank you letters to deployed military, food and coat drives for the homeless and much more.

During the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Albany community was hit hard and became one of Georgia's hot spots. In addition to hospitals overflowing, rampant deaths and widespread cases, Albany was faced with the threat of the Dougherty County School System no longer being able to provide meals to the 16,000 children in the district. CaMia purchased face masks to assist with providing personal protective equipment (PPE) to the school system. CaMia's House colleagues joined her efforts and raised additional funds to help her provide PPE not only to the school system, but also to local nursing homes and day cares.

CaMia was initiated into the Atlanta Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. and is a current member of the Albany Alumnae Chapter, where she has served on the chapter's executive board and various committees.
