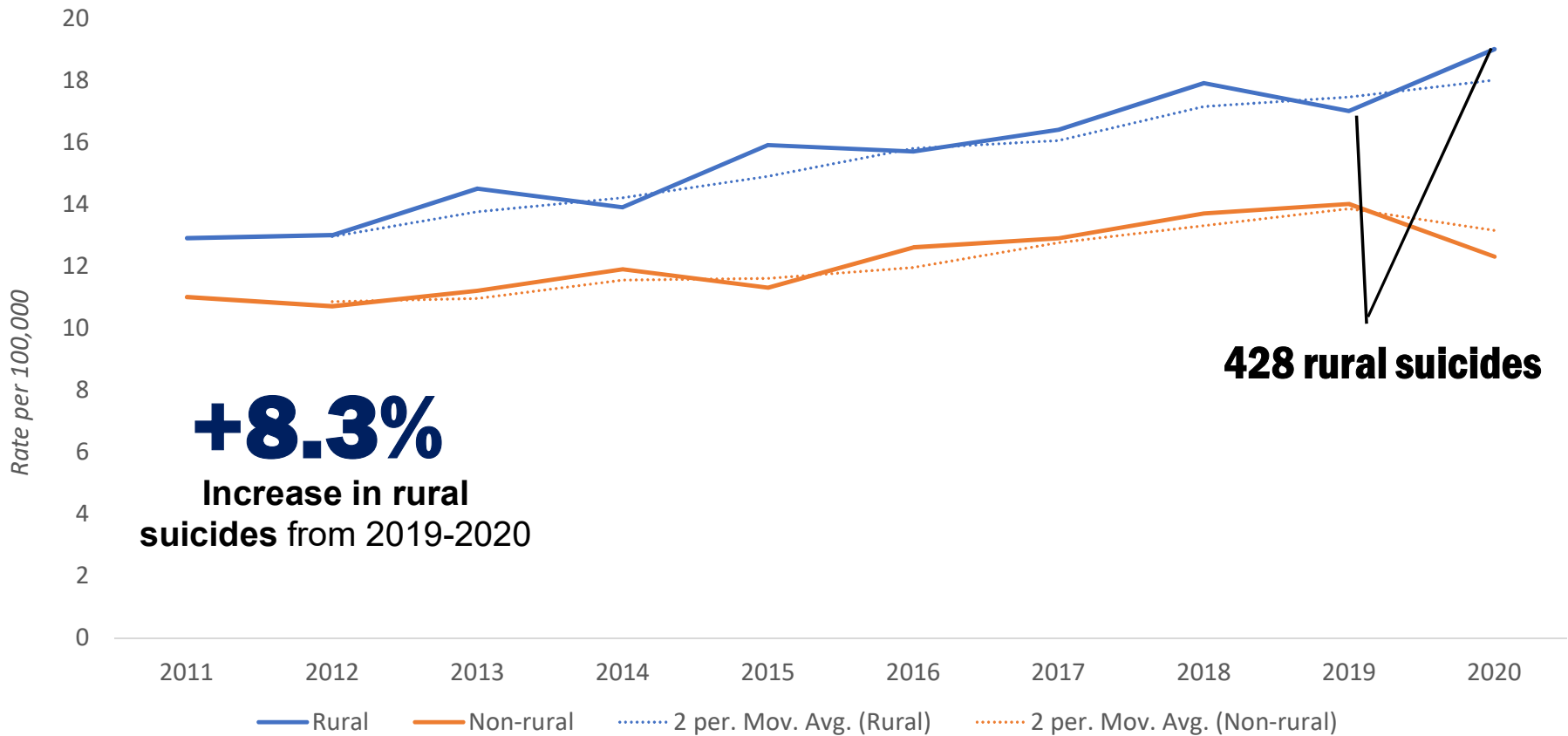

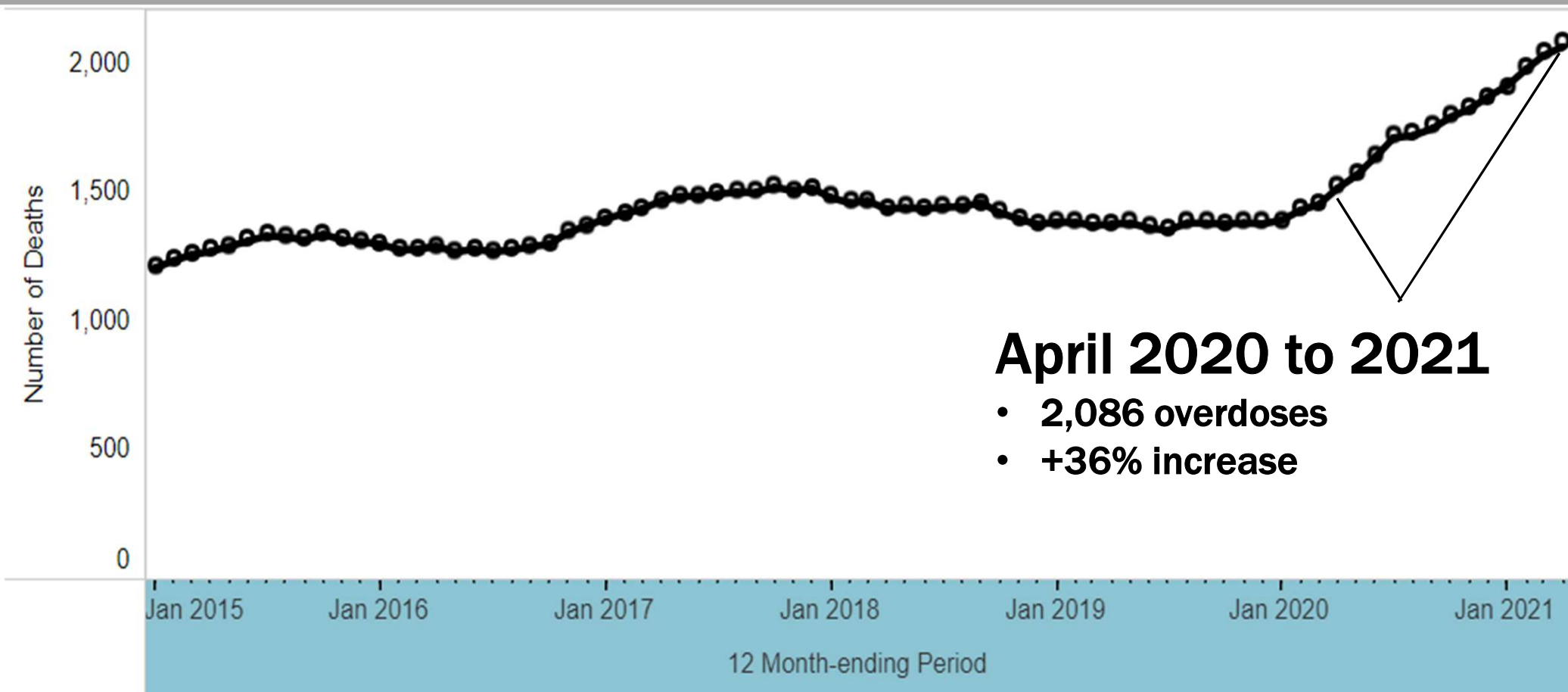
Age-adjusted Suicide Death Rates in Georgia

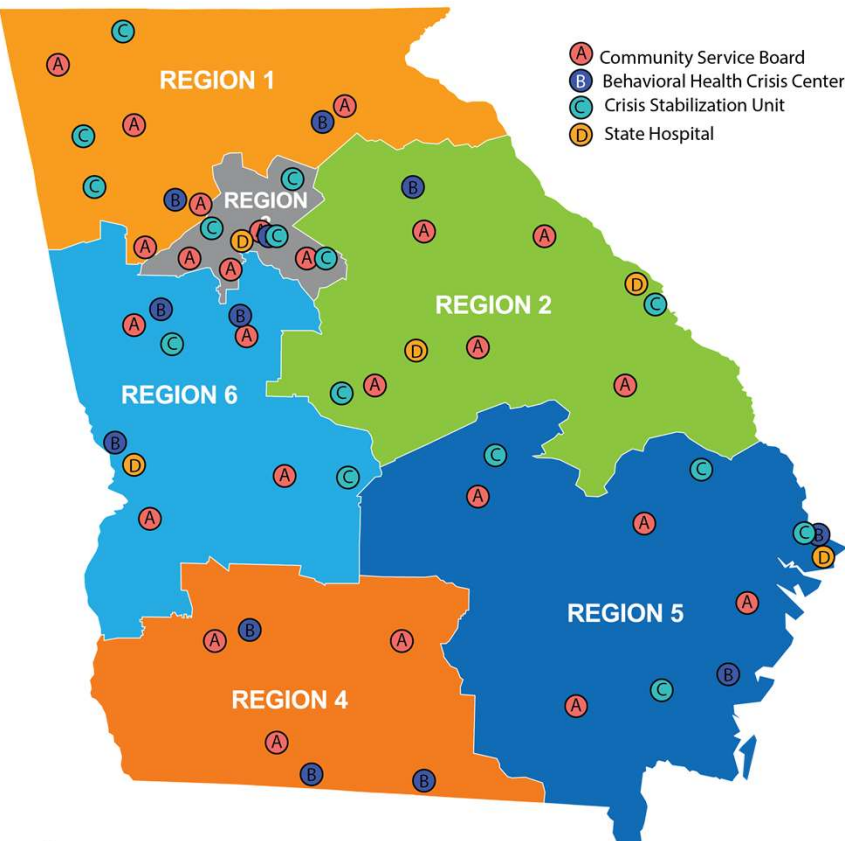

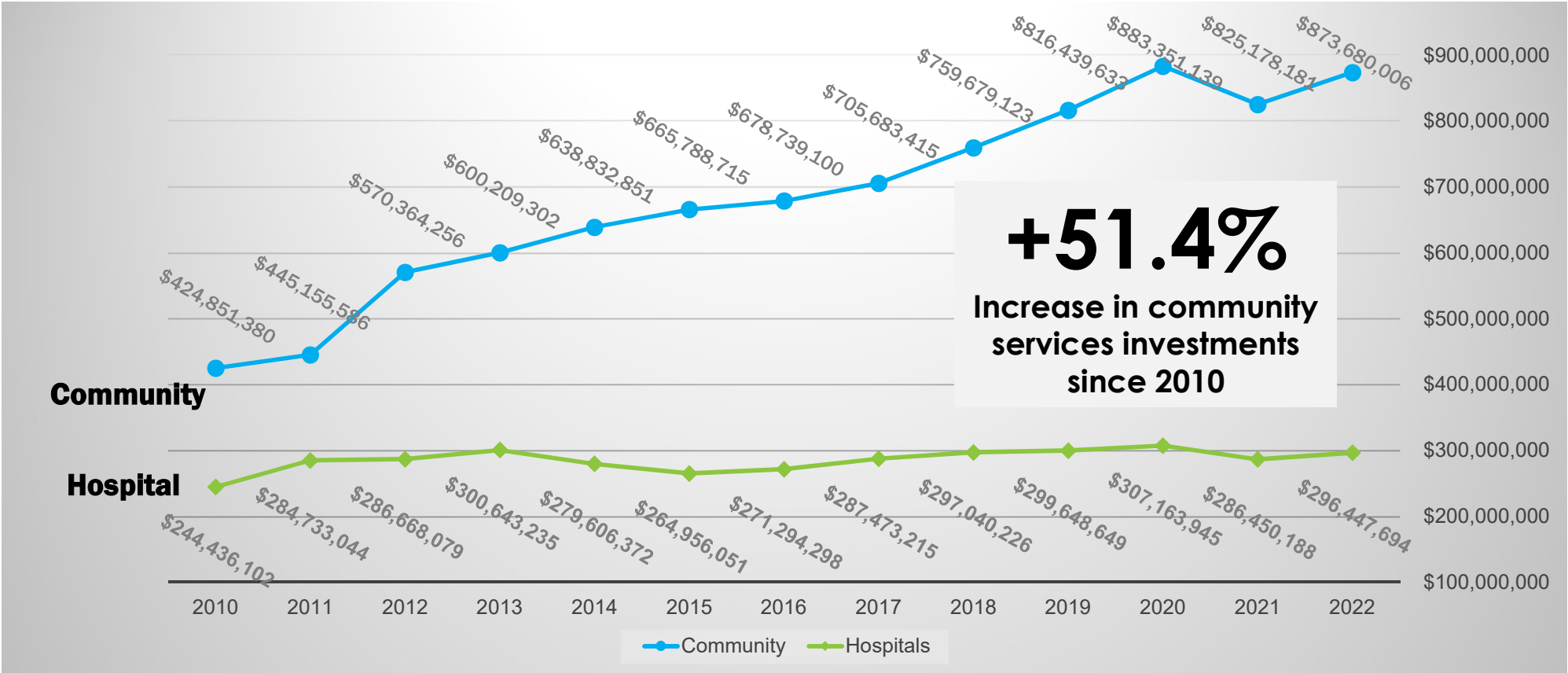

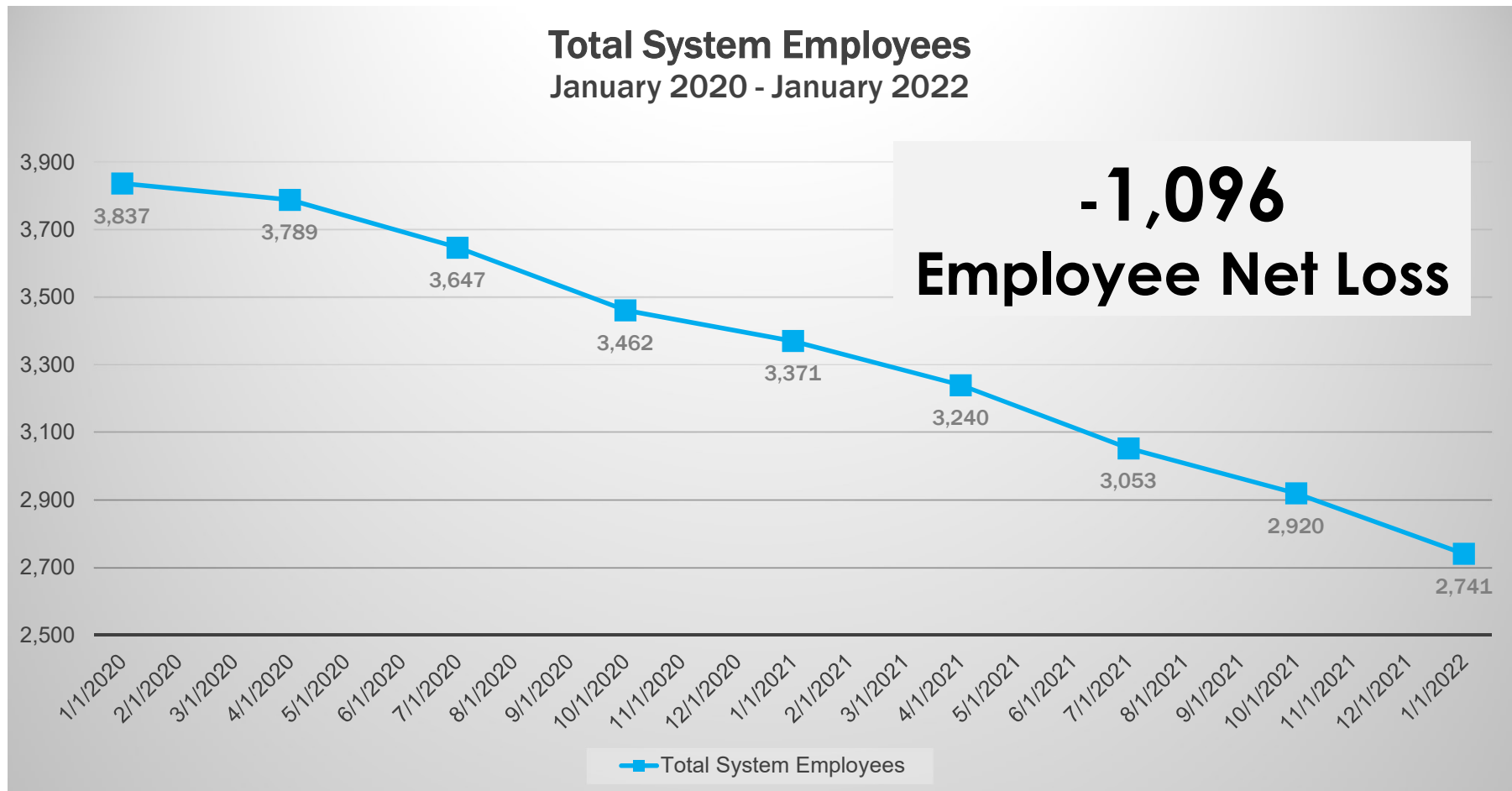

State Appropriations FY2010-FY2022**

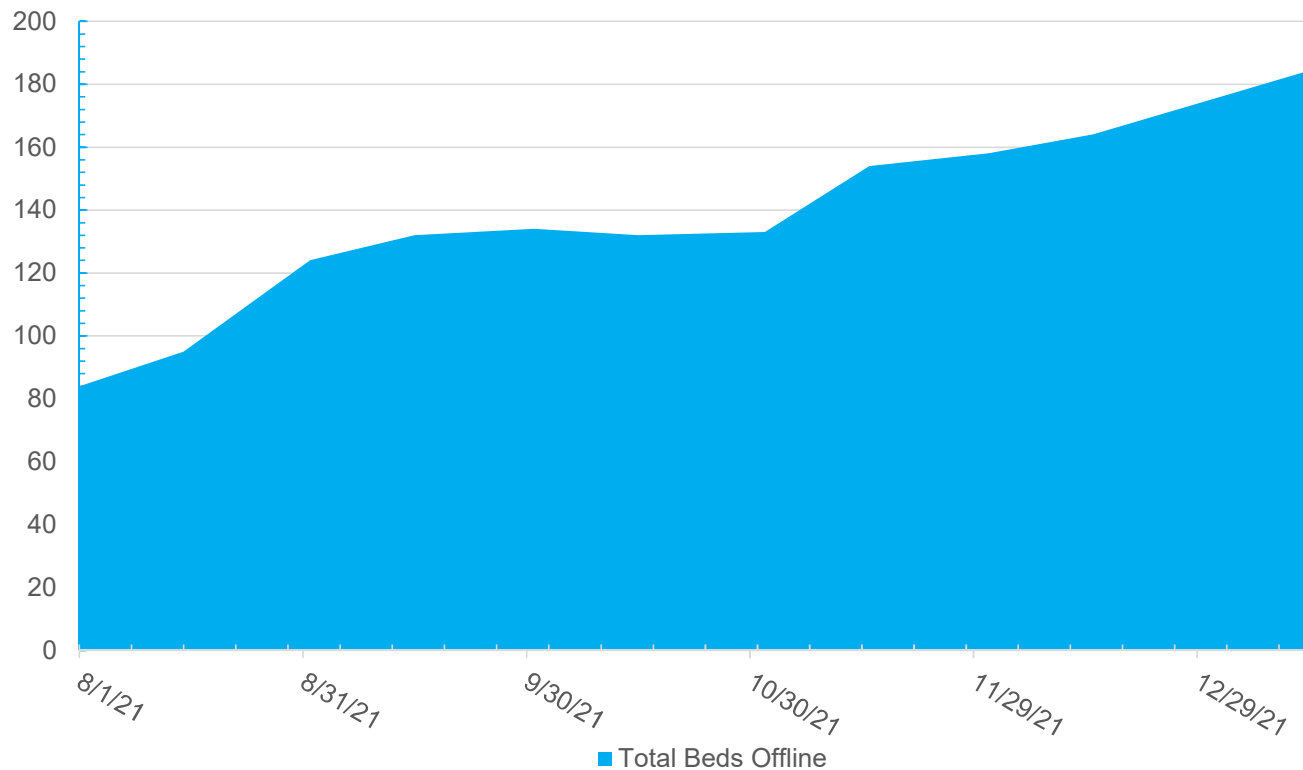


DBHDD Hospital System Employee Count

Workforce Impact














- Critical shortage of direct care professionals
- Family members forced to choose between caregiving and employment
- Providers declining referrals due to capacity
- **1:1** or higher staff to individual ratios increasingly difficult to meet
