

DOAS Risk Management FY 2022 Workers' Compensation Settlements

- The General Assembly entrusted DOAS Risk Management with \$150 million in Amended Fiscal Year 2022 to settle outstanding Workers' Compensation claims
- All funds were committed, 686 claims settled, resulting in projected reduced future cost of at least \$240 million (150% benefit)
- Settled claims included incidents from as far back as 1982
- In addition to settling claims, DOAS proactively working with agencies to reduce claims and associated costs





DOAS Risk Management External Forces Affecting Property Program




- The broader insurance markets are reacting to several years of numerous, significant loss events with higher costs for coverage
- 2021 had 20 billion-dollar events in the U.S. from tropical storms to wildfires to flooding to tornados to heat waves
- Since 2020 the U.S. has seen other historic events affecting property, commercial real estate, business interruption, and construction

In December 2022, we experienced several days of weather below freezing across parts of the state (designated as Winter Storm Elliot)






Newer (and Younger) Employees Do Not Stay as Long




DOAS Human Resources Administration And Older Generations are Close to Retirement













