

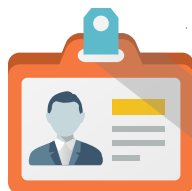
GEORGIA ELECTIONS: VOTER IDENTIFICATION

Georgia is one of **36** states which require or request voter identification at the polls

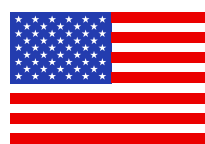

GEORGIA DRIVER'S LICENSE



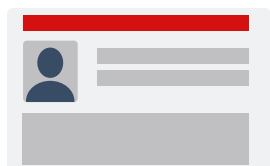
GOVERNMENT ISSUED EMPLOYEE ID

If a Georgia voter does not have a valid photo ID, a **Georgia Voter Identification Card** can be issued, free of charge, through the county registrar's office or the Department of Driver Services.

GEORGIA PASSES A LAW TO REQUIRE VOTER ID WHEN VOTING ABSENTEE-BY-MAIL



Prior to the 2021 passage of **SB 202**, Georgia validated absentee-by-mail voter identity through signature verification. Following the passage of **SB 202**, the state **now requires** voter identification both when absentee-by-mail voters apply for and vote via absentee ballot. If the voter does not have an acceptable form of identification, they are permitted to vote a **provisional ballot** which would be counted once the identification of the voter is confirmed.
