## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing and finding that pornography is a public health crisis leading to a broad
- 2 spectrum of individual and public health impacts and societal harms; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, pornography is creating a public health crisis, and, therefore, its harms are
- 4 beyond the capability of the individual to address alone; and
- 5 WHEREAS, efforts to prevent pornography exposure and addiction, to educate individuals
- 6 and families concerning its harms, and to develop recovery programs must be addressed
- 7 systemically in ways that hold broader influences accountable in order to counter the
- 8 sexually toxic environment it perpetuates; and
- 9 WHEREAS, pornography is contributing to the hyper-sexualization of teens, and even
- 10 prepubescent children, in our society; and
- 11 WHEREAS, due to the advances in technology and the universal availability of the Internet,
- 12 young children are exposed to pornography at an alarming rate, with 27 percent of older
- 13 millennials reporting that they first viewed pornography before puberty, and this leads to
- 14 low self-esteem, eating disorders, an increase in problematic sexual activity at younger ages,
- and an increased desire to engage in risky sexual behavior as young adolescents; and
- 16 WHEREAS, children and youth are exposed to pornography that oftentimes serves as their
- 17 sex education and shapes their sexual templates, and due to pornography treating women as
- objects and commodities for the viewer's use, it teaches girls they are to be used and boys to
- 19 be users; and
- WHEREAS, pornography normalizes violence and abuse of women and children, treating
- 21 them as objects and often depicting rape and abuse as if it were harmless; and

WHEREAS, pornography equates violence toward women and children with sex and pain

- 23 with pleasure which increases the demand for sex trafficking, prostitution, and child sexual
- 24 abuse; and
- 25 WHEREAS, pornography has potential detrimental effects of the user, such as emotional,
- 26 mental, and medical illnesses, shaping deviant sexual arousal, difficulty forming or
- 27 maintaining intimate relationships, brain development and functioning, problematic or
- 28 harmful sexual behaviors, and addiction.
- 29 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 30 the members of this body recognize the detrimental effects of pornography and find that it
- 31 is a public health crisis leading to serious mental and physical problems.
- 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 34 public and the press.
