- 1 To amend Chapter 1 of Title 34 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 general provisions relative to labor and industrial relations, so as to allow employees to use
- 3 sick leave for the care of immediate family members; to provide for definitions; to provide
- 4 for conditions to take leave; to provide for applicability; to provide for automatic repeal; to
- 5 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

- 8 Chapter 1 of Title 34 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
- 9 provisions relative to labor and industrial relations, is amended by adding a new Code section
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 "34-1-10.
- 12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 13 (1) 'Employee' means an individual who works for salary, wages, or other remuneration
- for an employer for at least 30 hours per week.
- 15 (2) 'Employee stock ownership plan' shall have the same meaning as provided in Section
- 16 4975(e)(7) of the Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. Section 4975(e)(7).
- 17 (3) 'Employer' means any individual or entity that employs 25 or more employees and
- shall include the State of Georgia and its political subdivisions and instrumentalities.
- 19 (4) 'Immediate family member' means an employee's child, spouse, grandchild,
- 20 grandparent, or parent or any dependents as shown in the employee's most recent tax
- 21 <u>return.</u>
- 22 (5) 'Sick leave' means time away from work by an employee, due to his or her own
- 23 <u>incapacity</u>, illness, or injury, for which the employee receives his or her regular salary,
- 24 wages, or other remuneration. The term 'sick leave' shall not include paid short-term or
- 25 <u>long-term disability.</u>

26 (b) An employer that provides sick leave shall allow an employee to use such sick leave

- 27 <u>for the care of an immediate family member; provided, however, that nothing in this Code</u>
- 28 section shall be construed to require an employer to offer sick leave or to require an
- 29 <u>employer to allow an employee to use more than five days of earned sick leave per</u>
- 30 <u>calendar year for the care of an immediate family member.</u>
- 31 (c) An employee shall not be entitled to use sick leave under this Code section until that
- 32 <u>leave has been earned. Any employee who uses such sick leave shall comply with the</u>
- 33 <u>terms of the employer's employee sick leave policy.</u>
- 34 (d) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to create a new cause of action against
- 35 <u>an employer.</u>
- 36 (e) This Code section shall not apply to any employer that offers to their employees an
- 37 <u>employee stock ownership plan.</u>
- 38 (f) This Code section shall be repealed in its entirety on July 1, 2020, unless extended by
- 39 <u>an Act of the General Assembly.</u>
