

The House Committee on Public Safety and Homeland Security offers the following substitute to HB 883:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to social services, so  
2 as to create the Legislative Gang Prevention and Intervention Commission; to provide for  
3 membership; to provide for powers, duties, and objectives; to provide for related matters; to  
4 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 **SECTION 1.**

7 Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to social services, is amended  
8 by adding a new chapter to read as follows:

9 "CHAPTER 11

10 49-11-1.

11 There is created the Legislative Gang Prevention and Intervention Commission. The  
12 commission shall submit an annual report recommending strategic, coordinated, and  
13 collaborative efforts between educational institutions and community and social services  
14 organizations for the implementation and maintenance of programs and initiatives designed  
15 to prevent and intervene in criminal gang participation by youth. Such report shall be  
16 submitted to the House Public Safety and Homeland Security Committee and the Senate  
17 Public Safety Committee no later than January 1 of each calendar year.

18 49-11-2.

19 (a) The Legislative Gang Prevention and Intervention Commission shall consist of 14  
20 members as follows:

21 (1) Two members who shall be appointed by the chairperson of the House Public Safety  
22 and Homeland Security Committee;

(2) Two members who shall be appointed by the chairperson of the Senate Public Safety Committee;

(3) A representative appointed by the Governor from the membership of the Georgia Sheriffs' Association;

(4) A representative appointed by the Governor from the membership of the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police;

(5) A representative appointed by the Governor from the membership of the District Attorneys Association of Georgia;

(6) A representative appointed by the Governor from the membership of the Georgia Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers;

(7) Six members who shall be educators or representatives of the community or social service organizations with youth programs as follows:

(A) Two members to be appointed by the Governor where one such member shall be designated by the Governor to serve as chairperson of the commission;

(B) Two members to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; and

(C) Two members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

(b) Members shall each be appointed for a term of two years and no member may serve more than two consecutive terms. All vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term by an appointee of the original appointing official.

(c) The commission shall hold regular meetings at such times and such places as it may deem necessary or convenient, to accomplish the objectives and purposes of this chapter. Special meetings may be called by the chairperson or a majority of the members of the commission.

(d) A quorum for transacting business shall be determined by the members of the commission.

(e) Members shall serve without compensation; provided, however, that any legislative member shall receive the allowances authorized by law for legislative members of interim legislative committees and any members who are state employees shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the same manner as they are reimbursed for expenses in their capacities as state employees.

The Legislative Gang Prevention and Intervention Commission shall have the following objectives:

(1) Submit an annual report recommending a plan for strategic, coordinated, and collaborative efforts between educational institutions and community and social services

60 (2) To provide informational resources, strategic guidance, research, and best practices  
61 to social services and community organizations in the implementation of programs and

63 **SECTION 2.**

64 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
