

The Senate Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Affairs offered the following substitute to SB 195:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 2-23-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2 definitions regarding hemp farming, so as to revise a definition; to provide for related
3 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

5 **SECTION 1.**

6 Code Section 2-23-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to definitions
7 regarding hemp farming, is amended by revising paragraph (10) as follows:

8 "(10)(A) 'Process' or 'processing' 'processing,' except as otherwise provided in
9 subparagraph (B) of this paragraph, means converting an agricultural commodity into
10 a legally marketable form.

11 (B) This ~~Such~~ term ~~does~~ shall not include:

12 (i) ~~merely~~ Merely placing raw or dried material into another container or packaging
13 raw or dried material for resale; or

14 (ii) Traditional farming practices such as those commonly known as drying, shucking
15 and bucking, storing, trimming, and curing."

SECTION 2.

17 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
