## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 6 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to domestic terrorism, so as to provide for a misdemeanor offense for certain acts of
- 3 domestic terrorism; to revise the definition of domestic terrorism; to amend Chapter 1 of
- 4 Title 28 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions of the
- 5 General Assembly, so as to establish a joint committee on domestic terrorism for assessing
- 6 and sharing information regarding domestic terrorism threats; to enact the "Protect Georgia
- 7 Domestic Terrorism Act"; to provide a short title; to amend Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title
- 8 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions of the Georgia
- 9 Bureau of Investigation, so as to provide for monitoring, investigating, and reporting
- 10 requirements regarding domestic terrorism; to provide for related matters; to provide for an
- 11 effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

14 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Protect Georgia Domestic Terrorism Act."

15 SECTION 2.

16 Article 6 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to

- 17 domestic terrorism, is amended in paragraph (2) of Code Section 16-11-220, relating to
- 18 definitions regarding domestic terrorism, as follows:
- 19 "(2) 'Domestic terrorism' means any <u>misdemeanor or</u> felony violation of, or attempt to
- commit a <u>misdemeanor or</u> felony violation of the laws of this state which, as part of a
- single unlawful act or a series of unlawful acts which are interrelated by distinguishing
- characteristics, is intended to cause serious bodily harm, kill any individual or group of
- 23 individuals, or disable or destroy critical infrastructure, a state or government facility, or
- a public transportation system when such disability or destruction results in major
- economic loss, and is intended to:"

SECTION 3.

- 27 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 16-11-221, relating to penalties,
- as follows:
- 29 "16-11-221.
- 30 (a) Any Except as provided in subsection (b), any person who commits domestic terrorism
- 31 shall be guilty of a felony and upon conviction thereof shall be punished as follows:
- 32 (1) If death results to any individual, by death, by imprisonment for life without parole,
- or by imprisonment for life;
- 34 (2) If kidnapping occurs, by imprisonment for not less than 15 nor more than 35 years,
- or by imprisonment for life;
- 36 (3) If serious bodily harm occurs, by imprisonment for not less than 15 nor more than 35
- years; or
- 38 (4) If critical infrastructure, a state or government facility, or a public transportation
- 39 system is disabled or destroyed, by imprisonment for not less than five nor more than 35
- 40 years.

41 (b) Any person who commits domestic terrorism by vandalizing property and causing

- 42 <u>damages equal to or less than \$10,000.00 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.</u>
- 43 (b)(c) No sentence imposed under <u>subsection</u> (a) of this Code section shall be suspended,
- stayed, probated, deferred, or withheld by the sentencing court; provided, however, that in
- 45 the court's discretion, the court may suspend, stay, probate, defer, or withhold part of such
- sentence when the prosecuting attorney and the defendant have agreed to such sentence."

47 **SECTION 4.** 

- 48 Chapter 1 of Title 28 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated relating to general
- 49 provisions regarding the General Assembly, is amended by adding a new Code section to
- 50 read as follows:
- 51 "<u>28-1-18.</u>
- 52 (a) There is established a joint committee of this state to be known officially as the
- 53 Committee on Domestic Terrorism, which shall be composed of members of both houses
- of the General Assembly, including the Lieutenant Governor; President Pro Tempore of
- 55 the Senate; and the majority leader, minority leader, and majority whip of the Senate; the
- 56 Speaker of the House of Representatives; Speaker Pro Tempore of the House of
- Representatives; and the majority leader, majority whip, and minority leader of the House
- of Representatives.
- 59 (b) The committee provided for under subsection (a) of this Code section shall consider
- 60 legislative matters concerning domestic terrorism and receive reports from the Georgia
- Bureau of Investigation as provided for under Code Section 35-5-8."

62 SECTION 5.

- Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 64 general provisions of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, is amended by adding a new Code
- 65 section, to read as follows:

- 66 "<u>35-5-8.</u>
- 67 (a) The Georgia Bureau of Investigation shall monitor, investigate, and collect state-wide
- data and other relevant data regarding possible threats of domestic terrorism as such term
- 69 <u>is defined in Code Section 16-11-220 from the United States Department of Homeland</u>
- 70 <u>Security, United States Department of Justice, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.</u>
- Such information shall, at least once per calendar week, be released to the Capitol Police
- 72 <u>Division of the Department of Public Safety, the Georgia State Patrol, and the Committee</u>
- on Domestic Terrorism.
- 74 (b) In exercising the authority provided for under this Code section with respect to the
- 75 <u>violation of laws related to domestic terrorism, agents of the Georgia Bureau of</u>
- 76 <u>Investigation shall have the authority to:</u>
- 77 (1) Obtain and execute arrest warrants;
- 78 (2) Obtain and execute search warrants;
- 79 (3) Arrest, without warrant, any person found to be in violation of laws related to
- 80 domestic terrorism or in the act of attempting to escape after violation of such laws, or
- 81 if for other cause there is likely to be a failure of enforcement of such laws, for want of
- an officer to issue a warrant;
- 83 (4) Make investigations in the enforcement of such laws and, in connection therewith,
- 84 go upon any property outside of federal and state owned buildings, posted or otherwise,
- in the performance of such duties;
- 86 (5) Seize and take possession of all property which is declared contraband under such
- 87 <u>laws; and</u>
- 88 (6) Carry firearms while performing such duties."
- SECTION 6.
- 90 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 91 without such approval.

92 **SECTION 7.** 

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed. 93
