A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 8-2-143 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to civil
2 and criminal penalty for violation of Section 610 of National Manufactured Housing
3 Construction and Safety Standards Act of 1974 and regulations and final orders issued
4 thereunder, so as to revise civil penalties; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
5 laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Code Section 8-2-143 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to civil and
9 criminal penalty for violation of Section 610 of National Manufactured Housing
10 Construction and Safety Standards Act of 1974 and regulations and final orders issued
11 thereunder, is amended by revising subsection (a) as follows:

12 "(a) **Civil penalties.** Any person in this state who violates any provision of Section 610
13 of the National Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Act
14 of 1974, 42 U.S.C. Section 5401, et seq., or any regulation or final order issued
15 thereunder, shall be liable to the State of Georgia for a civil penalty not to
16 exceed ~~\$1,000.00~~ the maximum civil penalty set forth in 24 C.F.R. Section 3282.10 for

17 each such violation. Each violation of ~~Section 610 of the aforementioned act~~ 42 U.S.C.
18 Section 5401, et seq., or of any regulation or order issued thereunder shall constitute a
19 separate violation with respect to each manufactured home or with respect to each failure
20 or refusal to allow or perform an act required thereby, except that the maximum civil
21 penalty may not exceed ~~\$1 million~~ the maximum civil penalty set forth in 24 C.F.R.
22 Section 3282.10 for any related series of violations occurring within one year from the
23 date of the first violation."
