

Senate Bill 374

**AS PASSED SENATE**

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Part 3 of Article 4 of Chapter 12 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia  
2 Annotated, relating to the Georgia Data Analytic Center, so as to provide for definitions; to  
3 establish the Georgia Data Analytic Center as an agent of all executive state agencies; to  
4 provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and  
5 for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Part 3 of Article 4 of Chapter 12 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,  
9 relating to the Georgia Data Analytic Center, is amended by adding two new paragraphs to  
10 Code Section 45-12-150, relating to definitions, to read as follows:

11 "(2.1)(A) 'Executive state agency' means any agency, authority, board, bureau,  
12 commission, department, division, office, or other unit of the executive branch of state  
13 government whether established by or pursuant to the Constitution of the State of  
14 Georgia, the Official Code of Georgia, any administrative rule or regulation, or any  
15 executive order.

16 (B) Such term shall not include:

- 17 (i) The legislative or judicial branches of state government;  
18 (ii) Any political subdivision;  
19 (iii) The Georgia State Financing and Investment Commission; or  
20 (iv) The Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia."  
21 "(3.1)(A) 'Government information' means any information created, received,  
22 maintained, or stored by, or otherwise in the control of, an executive state agency,  
23 regardless of the form or the media on which the information is recorded.  
24 (B) Such term shall not include:  
25 (i) Investigative records of law enforcement agencies;  
26 (ii) Confidential investigative records related to an ongoing investigation and any  
27 related information classified as confidential; or  
28 (iii) Confidential advisory opinions requested or given by the office of the inspector  
29 general."

30 **SECTION 2.**

31 Said part is further amended by revising Code Section 45-12-153, relating to access to data,  
32 as follows:

33 "45-12-153.

34 (a) Any state agency or department that creates, receives, or maintains publicly supported  
35 program, fiscal, or health data shall, only after execution of an enforceable data use, data  
36 sharing, or other similar agreement that is acceptable to the state agency or department,  
37 transmit or allow access to such data as is necessary and appropriate to further the purposes  
38 of this part and shall cooperate with GDAC Project requests for receipt of or access to such  
39 data. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any state agency or department shall not be required  
40 to transmit data which it creates, receives, or maintains to the GDAC Project or to allow  
41 access to such data if the Attorney General's review or the applicable state agency's or  
42 department's review determines that such transmission or access would violate state or

43 federal law. The Attorney General's review shall include consideration of an analysis from  
44 the state agency or department whose data are being requested, and shall include the  
45 reason, if any, that the requested data cannot be transmitted or allowed for access to the  
46 Georgia Data Analytic Center as an agent of the state agency or department as provided in  
47 subsection (c) of this Code section.

48 (b) This Code section shall not prohibit the office or any agency or department from  
49 creating, receiving, maintaining, or transmitting data in data systems that are separate and  
50 distinct from the GDAC Project.

51 (c) The Georgia Data Analytic Center is considered to be an agent of all executive state  
52 agencies sharing government information and is an authorized receiver of government  
53 information under the statutory or administrative law that governs such government  
54 information.

55 (d) Interagency and intra-agency data sharing under this part does not constitute a  
56 disclosure or release under any statutory or administrative law that governs the government  
57 information. In no event shall government information accessed, received, or obtained by  
58 the Georgia Data Analytic Center, which is protected by any form of confidentiality or  
59 privilege, cause such information to be subject to disclosure, including, but not limited to,  
60 disclosure pursuant to Code Sections 50-18-70 and 50-18-72."

61 **SECTION 3.**

62 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law  
63 without such approval.

64 **SECTION 4.**

65 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
