## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 40-3-21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 application for first certificate of title for motor vehicles, so as to provide for acceptance of
- 3 electronic copies of certificates of title issued in another state or country; to provide for
- 4 related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Code Section 40-3-21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to application for
- 8 first certificate of title for motor vehicles, is amended by revising subsection (c) as follows:
- 9 ''(c)(1) If the application refers to a vehicle last previously registered in another state or
- 10 country, the application shall contain or be accompanied by:
- 11 (A) Any certificate of title issued by the other state or country; and
- 12 (B) Any other information and documents the commissioner reasonably requires to
- establish the ownership of the vehicle and the existence or nonexistence of security
- interests in it and liens against it.

(2) If the application refers to a vehicle last previously registered in another state and if the applicant is the last previously registered owner in such state, the application need not contain the name and address of the person from whom the vehicle was acquired.
(3) For purposes of satisfying the requirements of this subsection, a county tag agent shall accept an electronic copy of a certificate of title issued by another state or country.
