

House Bill 169

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend an Act providing for the compensation and expenses of the chairperson and
2 members of the Board of Education of Carroll County, approved March 25, 1986 (Ga. L.
3 1986, p. 4720), so as to change provisions relating to compensation of the members of the
4 board; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 **SECTION 1.**

7 An Act providing for the compensation and expenses of the chairperson and members of the
8 Board of Education of Carroll County, approved March 25, 1986 (Ga. L. 1986, p. 4720), is
9 amended by revising Section 1 as follows:

10 "SECTION 1.

11 (a) The chairperson of the Board of Education of Carroll County shall receive \$1,200.00
12 each month as compensation for service on the board. The vice-chairperson of the Board
13 of Education of Carroll County shall receive \$1,100.00 each month as compensation for
14 service on the board. Each of the remaining members of the Board of Education of Carroll
15 County shall receive \$1,000.00 each month as compensation for service on the board.

- 16 (b) While meeting or traveling outside Carroll County as a member of the board on official
17 business first authorized by a majority of the board, the chairperson, vice-chairperson, or
18 any member of the board shall receive reimbursement for actual expenses necessarily
19 incurred in connection therewith. The accounts for such service and expenses shall be
20 submitted for approval to the county school superintendent.
- 21 (c) The compensation and expenses of the chairperson, vice-chairperson, and members of
22 the board of education shall be paid only from the local tax funds available to such board
23 for educational purposes."

24 **SECTION 2.**

25 This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2024.

26 **SECTION 3.**

27 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
