

Senators Cowser of the 46th, Walker of the 20th, Tillery of the 19th, Albers of the 56th, Robertson of the 29th, and others offered the following amendment:

Amend the Senate Committee on Economic Development and Tourism substitute to HB 237 (LC 36 5577S) by inserting "to provide bettors with certain rights;" after "disorder;" on line 13.

By inserting between lines 888 and 889 the following:

Part 5A

50-27-175.

Bettors shall have certain rights as set forth in this part.

50-27-176.

Bettors shall have the right to access information necessary for making wagers, as well as information demonstrating that the licensee's offerings are administered legally and fairly in all respects. Such information includes but is not limited to:

(1) The handling of wagers;

(2) The odds and pertinent information used to calculate those odds;

(3) Payout amounts and schedule of payouts;

(4) Systems for reporting suspicions of fraud, such as internal reporting protocols and available legal actions;

(5) Prohibition of certain parties with an interest in or ability to affect the outcome of a sporting event from betting on such sporting events;

19 (6) The source of data utilized to determine outcomes of wagers;

20 (7) Contact information for the licensee;

21 (8) Resources for problem gambling or betting or gambling disorders, expressed in a
22 clear and easily accessible manner; and

23 (9) How to limit amounts of individual or aggregate wagers within specified time periods
24 and later deposits into accounts.

26 Bettors shall have the right to privacy and protection of their personally identifiable
27 information and to the security of their funds and financial activities on sports betting
28 platforms.

29 50-27-178.

30 Licensees shall provide bettors with easy access to resources about the warning signs and
31 treatment of problem gambling or betting or gambling disorders and shall be proactive in
32 preventing at-risk customers from developing problem gambling or betting or gambling
33 disorders by implementing responsible gaming programs, training, and other practices to
34 help bettors participate responsibly.

36 A bettor shall have the right to recourse against a licensee in the event he or she believes
37 a transaction or other interaction has been mishandled. Such recourse is essential to
38 establish the credibility of sports betting and to maintain consumer trust. Bettors shall have
39 the right to seek relief as may be provided in this article and by rules and regulations of the
40 corporation. Licensees shall provide a clear, expeditious protocol to address concerns
41 raised by bettors.
