

Senate Resolution 616

ADOPTED SENATE**A RESOLUTION**

1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution so as to provide that the General Assembly by
2 general law may provide for the allocation of certain additional penalties and assessments
3 to the Victims of Human Trafficking Fund for the purpose of providing care and
4 rehabilitative and social services to individuals in this state who have been or may be
5 sexually exploited; to provide for related matters; to provide for the submission of this
6 amendment for ratification or rejection; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 Article III, Section IX, Paragraph VI of the Constitution is amended by revising
10 subparagraph (o) as follows:

11 "(o) The General Assembly may provide by general law for additional penalties in any
12 case in any court in this state in which a person is adjudged guilty of keeping a place of
13 prostitution, pimping, pandering, pandering by compulsion, solicitation of sodomy,
14 masturbation for hire, trafficking of persons for sexual servitude, or sexual exploitation of
15 children and may impose assessments on adult entertainment establishments as defined by
16 law; and such appropriated amount shall not lapse as required by Article III, Section IX,
17 Paragraph IV(c) and shall not be subject to the limitations of subparagraph (a) of this

Paragraph; Article III, Section V, Paragraph II; Article VII, Section III, Paragraph II(a); or Article VII, Section III, Paragraph IV. The General Assembly may provide by general law for the allocation of such assessments and additional penalties to the Safe Harbor for Sexually Exploited Children Fund and the Victims of Human Trafficking Fund for the specified purpose of meeting any and all costs, or any portion of the costs, of providing care and rehabilitative and social services to individuals in this state who have been or may be sexually exploited. The General Assembly may provide by general law for the administration of such fund by such authority as the General Assembly shall determine."

SECTION 2.

The above proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be published and submitted as provided in Article X, Section I, Paragraph II of the Constitution. The ballot submitting the above proposed amendment shall have written or printed thereon the following:

"() YES Shall the Constitution of Georgia be amended so as to allow additional penalties for criminal cases in which a person is adjudged guilty of trafficking an individual for labor servitude or sexual servitude to fund the Victims of Human Trafficking Fund to pay for care and rehabilitative and social services for individuals in this state who have been or may be sexually exploited?"

All persons desiring to vote in favor of ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "Yes." All persons desiring to vote against ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "No." If such amendment shall be ratified as provided in said Paragraph of the Constitution, it shall become a part of the Constitution of this state.
