

ADOPTED

Senators Anavitarte of the 31st and Dixon of the 45th offered the following amendment #2:

1 *Amend the Senate Committee on Education and Youth substitute to HB 282 (LC 49 1919S)*
 2 *by replacing line 14 with the following:*
 3 require local education agencies to implement a mobile panic alert system capable of
 4 connecting disparate emergency services technologies to ensure real-time coordination
 5 between multiple state and local first responder agencies in the event of a school security
 6 emergency; to provide for exceptions; to require the Department of Administrative Services
 7 to conduct market research and possibly issue a competitive solicitation for multiple vendors
 8 to provide for such systems; to provide for a short title; to provide for related matters; to
 9 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

10 *By inserting after line 138 the following:*

11 **SECTION 6.**

12 Said chapter is further amended in Article 11, relating to public school property and facilities,
 13 by adding a new part to read as follows:

14 "Part 4

15 20-2-590.

16 (a) This Code section shall be known and may be cited as 'Alyssa's Law.'

17 (b)(1) Not later than July 1, 2026, each local education agency, as that term is defined
 18 in Code Section 20-2-167.1, shall implement a mobile panic alert system capable of
 19 connecting disparate emergency services technologies to ensure real-time coordination

20 between local and state law enforcement and first responder agencies. Such system shall
21 be known as the 'Alyssa's Alert' and shall integrate with existing technology found in
22 each local public safety answering point infrastructure to transmit 9-1-1 calls and mobile
23 activations.

24 (2) In addition to the requirements of paragraph (1) of this subsection, each local
25 education agency may implement additional strategies or systems to ensure real-time
26 coordination between multiple first responder agencies in the event of a school security
27 emergency.

28 (3) A local education agency shall not be required to procure or implement new or
29 additional capabilities if, as of July 1, 2025, such local education agency has already
30 implemented a mobile panic alert system with capabilities which meet the requirements
31 of paragraph (1) of this subsection.

32 (c) Not later than December 1, 2025, the Department of Administrative Services shall
33 conduct market research in consultation with the State School Superintendent and the
34 Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency to identify whether an
35 existing competitive source of supply is available for a system that satisfies the
36 requirements of paragraph (1) of subsection (b) of this Code section from multiple vendors
37 for use by local education agencies. If no existing source of supply exists, the Department
38 of Administrative Services shall issue a competitive solicitation for such source of supply
39 no later than January 1, 2026."

40 *By redesignating Sections 1A, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 on lines 32, 52, 59, 90, 139, and 169,*
41 *respectively, as Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 7 and 8.*
