

House Bill 147

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 25 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
2 Georgia Technology Authority, so as to provide for an annual inventory of artificial
3 intelligence usage by state agencies; to provide for annual reports of such; to provide for the
4 authority to develop and establish certain policies; to provide for related matters; to repeal
5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Chapter 25 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Georgia
9 Technology Authority, is amended by revising Code Section 50-25-7.9, which is reserved,
10 as follows:

11 "50-25-7.9.

12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'artificial intelligence' means a machine based
13 system that can, for a given set of human defined objectives, make predictions,
14 recommendations, or decisions influencing real or virtual environments. Artificial
15 intelligence systems use machine based and human based inputs to perceive real and virtual

16 environments, abstract such perceptions into models through analysis in an automated
17 manner, and use model inference to formulate options for information or action.

18 (b) The authority shall:

19 (1) Not later than December 31, 2025, and annually thereafter, conduct an inventory of
20 all systems that employ artificial intelligence and are in use by any agency. Each
21 inventory shall include, but not be limited to, the following information for each such
22 system:

23 (A) The name of the system and the vendor, if any, that provided such system;

24 (B) A description of the general capabilities and uses of such system;

25 (C) Whether such system was used to independently make, inform, or materially
26 support a conclusion, decision, or judgment; and

27 (D) Whether such system underwent an impact assessment prior to implementation;
28 and

29 (2) Not later than December 31, 2026, develop and establish policies and procedures
30 concerning the development, procurement, implementation, utilization, and ongoing
31 assessment of systems that employ artificial intelligence and are in use by agencies. Such
32 policies and procedures shall, at a minimum:

33 (A) Govern the procurement, implementation, and ongoing assessment of such systems
34 by agencies; and

35 (B) Ensure that no such system results in any unlawful discrimination against any
36 individual or group of individuals.

37 (c) The authority shall prepare an annual report on the inventory of artificial intelligence
38 in use by agencies, as provided for in paragraph (1) of subsection (b) of this Code section.
39 Such report shall be provided to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and members of the
40 House of Representatives and Senate; provided, however, that the authority shall not be
41 required to distribute copies of the report but shall notify the recipients of the availability
42 of such report in the manner deemed by the authority to be most effective and efficient.

43 (d) All state agencies shall cooperate with the authority in the administration of this Code
44 section. Reserved."

45 **SECTION 2.**

46 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
