

Senate Bill 84

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 40-2-86 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2 special license plates promoting or supporting certain worthy agencies, funds, or nonprofit
3 corporations with proceeds disbursed to the general fund and the agency, fund, or nonprofit
4 corporation, so as to establish a specialty license plate honoring the Shepherd Center; to
5 establish a specialty license plate benefiting the Georgia Transplant Foundation; to provide
6 for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to provide for compliance with
7 constitutional requirements; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.**

10 Code Section 40-2-86 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to special license
11 plates promoting or supporting certain worthy agencies, funds, or nonprofit corporations with
12 proceeds disbursed to the general fund and the agency, fund, or nonprofit corporation, is
13 amended in subsection (l) by adding new paragraphs to read as follows:

14 “(71) A special license plate honoring the Shepherd Center. The funds raised by the sale
15 of this special license plate shall be disbursed to Shepherd Center, Inc.

16 (72) A special license plate recognizing the importance of organ donation. The funds
17 raised by the sale of this special license plate shall be disbursed to the Georgia Transplant
18 Foundation."

19 **SECTION 2.**

20 This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2026.

21 **SECTION 3.**

22 In accordance with the requirements of Article III, Section IX, Paragraph VI(n) of the
23 Constitution of the State of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the
24 requisite two-thirds' majority vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

25 **SECTION 4.**

26 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
