A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the members of the Georgia Black Republican Council; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Black History Month is a time to honor the rich heritage, resilience, and
3 achievements of Black Americans who have shaped the United States through their
4 unwavering faith, hard work, and commitment to freedom; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Black Americans have played a pivotal role in advancing the principles of
6 liberty, justice, and equal opportunity enshrined in our Constitution, from the abolitionist
7 movement to the civil rights era and beyond; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the contributions of Black entrepreneurs, inventors, scholars, and leaders have
9 been instrumental in strengthening the economic, cultural, and moral fabric of our nation;

- 11 WHEREAS, Black Americans have overcome tremendous adversity through perseverance,
12 faith, family values, and a strong belief in the American Dream; and

13 WHEREAS, this month is an opportunity to recognize the importance of educational
14 empowerment, economic self-sufficiency, and civic engagement in ensuring the prosperity
15 and advancement of all communities; and

16 WHEREAS, the principles of limited government, free enterprise, and individual
17 responsibility have long been championed by great Black leaders, from Booker T.
18 Washington to Justice Clarence Thomas; and

19 WHEREAS, members of the Georgia Black Republican Council, an auxiliary of the Georgia
20 Republican Party, exemplify the aforementioned belief.
