## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and commending the Junior League Movement on the occasion of its 125th  
2 anniversary and honoring its enduring legacy of developing women leaders and  
3 strengthening communities through volunteer service, civic engagement, and advocacy; and  
4 for other purposes.

5 WHEREAS, the Junior League was founded in 1901 by Mary Harriman with the vision of  
6 empowering women to improve their communities through trained volunteer leadership; and

7 WHEREAS, for 125 years, the Junior League Movement has advanced women's leadership  
8 for meaningful community impact through volunteer action, collaboration, and leadership  
9 development; and

10 WHEREAS, the Association of Junior Leagues International supports a global network of  
11 nearly 300 local Leagues across multiple countries, mobilizing more than 112,000 women  
12 committed to strengthening communities through service and leadership; and

13 WHEREAS, the Junior Leagues of Georgia State Public Affairs Committee (JLGA SPAC)  
14 serves as a statewide training and advocacy body that educates members on the legislative  
15 process and coordinates nonpartisan public policy engagement across Georgia; and

16 WHEREAS, JLGA SPAC supports informed advocacy efforts focused on the aid and  
17 protection of women and girls, equity, healthcare access, and education, while preparing  
18 women to serve as effective civic leaders in nonprofit organizations, public service,  
19 education, healthcare, and business; and

20 WHEREAS, members of the Junior League Movement have contributed thousands of  
21 volunteer hours and significant financial resources to advance education, family stability,  
22 health and well-being, civic engagement, and community vitality throughout the State of  
23 Georgia; and

24 WHEREAS, the celebration of the 125th anniversary of the Junior League Movement  
25 provides an opportunity to honor the women who built this legacy and to inspire future  
26 generations to lead with purpose, integrity, and impact.

27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
28 the members of this body recognize and commend the Junior League Movement on its 125th  
29 anniversary and extend their appreciation to Junior League members, past and present, for  
30 their enduring contributions to leadership development and community improvement.

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of this body acknowledge the continued  
32 service of the Junior Leagues of Georgia and the Junior Leagues of Georgia State Public  
33 Affairs Committee in advancing civic leadership, equity, education, healthcare access, and  
34 the well-being of women and girls across the state.

35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
36 and directed to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to the  
37 Junior League Movement.
