

Senate Bill 524

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 40-2-86 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2 license plates promoting or supporting certain agencies, funds, or nonprofit corporations with
3 proceeds disbursed to the general fund and the agency, fund, or nonprofit corporation, so as
4 to establish a specialty license plate honoring Girl Scouts of Georgia; to establish a specialty
5 plate honoring the 250th anniversary of the United States of America's independence; to
6 provide for related matters; to provide for compliance with constitutional requirements; to
7 provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.**

10 Code Section 40-2-86 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to license plates
11 promoting or supporting certain agencies, funds, or nonprofit corporations with proceeds
12 disbursed to the general fund and the agency, fund, or nonprofit corporation, is amended by
13 adding new paragraphs to subsection (l) to read as follows:

14 "(76) A special license plate honoring Girl Scouts of Georgia. The funds raised by the
15 sale of this special license plate shall be disbursed equally to the Girl Scouts of Greater
16 Atlanta and the Girl Scouts of Historic Georgia organization.

17 (77) A special license plate commemorating the anniversary of the United States of
18 America's independence. Such design shall include the phrase '250 years of freedom and
19 liberty' in place of the county decal. The funds raised by the sale of this special license
20 plate shall be disbursed to the Georgia Historical Society."

21 **SECTION 2.**

22 In accordance with the requirements of Article III, Section IX, Paragraph VI(n) of the
23 Constitution of the State of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the
24 requisite two-thirds' majority vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

25 **SECTION 3.**

26 This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2027.

27 **SECTION 4.**

28 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
