## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing March 5, 2026, as Licensed Professional Counselors Appreciation Day at the  
2 state capitol; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Licensed Professional Counselors (LPCs) in the State of Georgia provide vital  
4 mental health services and actively work to bridge the gap in mental health disparities,  
5 ensuring that individuals from all backgrounds, races, socio-economic statuses, and cultures  
6 have equal access to quality mental health care; and

7 WHEREAS, these dedicated LPCs undergo rigorous training and education that encompasses  
8 crucial areas such as psychopathology, testing and assessment, ethics, research, diversity,  
9 career development, and human development, equipping them to address the multifaceted  
10 challenges faced by our citizens; and

11 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia proudly recognizes and supports the more than 13,000  
12 licensed professional counselors and licensed associate professional counselors, each of  
13 whom contributes significantly to the mental and emotional well-being of our community  
14 members, reinforcing the strength and resilience of our great state; and

15 WHEREAS, inspired by the mission of the Licensed Professional Counselors Association  
16 of Georgia (LPCAGA), which aims to support the profession and professionalism of  
17 professional counselors, we acknowledge the pivotal role LPCs play in mental health  
18 treatment, ensuring that every individual in need receives the quality care and support they  
19 deserve; and

20 WHEREAS, the establishment of the 988-crisis line, an essential help line for those in dire  
21 need, now has a more extensive network of dedicated practitioners to refer to, thanks largely  
22 to the commitment and expertise of our LPCs; and

23 WHEREAS, we commend the autonomy and comprehensive capabilities of our LPCs who  
24 are sanctioned to practice independently, bill insurance companies directly, diagnose clients,  
25 administer vital clinical assessments, and conduct thorough mental health evaluations  
26 independently.

27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
28 the members of this body recognize March 5, 2026, as Licensed Professional Counselors  
29 Appreciation Day at the state capitol and encourage all Georgians to recognize the  
30 importance of healthy minds and the noble work of our state's Licensed Professional  
31 Counselors.
