A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the life of Mr. Bryce Alan Johnson and dedicating a bridge in his memory; and
2 for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Mr. Bryce Alan Johnson graduated as valedictorian and STAR student of 1990
4 from Tiftarea Academy; and

5 WHEREAS, he graduated magna cum laude from Brewton-Parker College with a bachelor's
6 degree, earned a master's degree from Valdosta State University, and obtained a law degree
7 from Mercer University; and

8 WHEREAS, Mr. Johnson began his legal career as an assistant district attorney in the
9 Oconee Judicial Circuit District Attorney's Office and later served as an associate at the
10 Carter and Richbourg law firm and as assistant solicitor-general of Tift County; and

11 WHEREAS, he was elected as solicitor-general of Worth County in 2008 and was elected
12 district attorney of the Tifton Judicial Circuit in 2020; and

13 WHEREAS, Mr. Johnson's leadership and vision were instrumental to numerous district and
14 state Republican organizations, including through multiple county chairmanships, two
15 district chairmanships, and participation with the Republican State Committee; and

16 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that this remarkable and distinguished
17 Georgian be recognized appropriately by dedicating a bridge in his memory.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE GENERAL
19 ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA that the bridge on State Route 20 over Ty Ty Creek at the
20 Worth-Tift county line is dedicated as the Bryce Johnson Memorial Bridge.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and
22 directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the Bryce Johnson Memorial
23 Bridge.

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
25 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
26 family of Mr. Bryce Alan Johnson and to the Department of Transportation.
