

House Bill 956 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 12-8-27.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
2 Solid Waste Trust Fund, so as to authorize use of funds for implementation of the provisions  
3 of a solid waste management program in this state; to provide for related matters; to repeal  
4 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 **SECTION 1.**

7 Code Section 12-8-27.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to Solid Waste  
8 Trust Fund, is amended by revising subsection (c) as follows:

9 "(c) All of the money appropriated to the Solid Waste Trust Fund pursuant to  
10 subsection (b) of this Code section shall be dedicated for use only for the following  
11 purposes:

12 (1) To take whatever emergency action is necessary or appropriate to assure that the  
13 public health or safety is not threatened whenever there is a release or substantial threat  
14 of a release of contaminants from a disposal facility;

15 (2) To take preventive or corrective actions where the release of contaminants presents  
16 an actual or potential threat to human health or the environment and where the owner or

17 operator has not been identified or is unable or unwilling to perform corrective action,  
18 including but not limited to closure and postclosure care of a disposal facility and  
19 provisions for providing alternative water supplies;

20 (3) To take such actions as may be necessary to monitor and provide postclosure care of  
21 any disposal facility, including preventive and corrective actions, without regard to the  
22 identity or solvency of the owner thereof, commencing five years after the date of  
23 completing closure;

24 (4) To take such actions as may be necessary to implement the provisions of a scrap tire  
25 management program in this state, particularly as may be related to the cleanup of scrap  
26 tire disposal piles and facilities, regulation of tire carriers and other handlers, and  
27 disbursement of grants and loans to cities, counties, and other persons as may be  
28 necessary to implement fully the provisions of this part; ~~and~~

29 (5) To fulfill any purpose provided in subsection (c) of Code Section 12-8-37.1; and

30 (6) To take such actions as may be necessary to implement the provisions of a solid  
31 waste management program in this state, particularly regarding permitting, monitoring,  
32 regulation or guidance development, inspections, and enforcement."

33 **SECTION 2.**

34 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
