A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the House Study Committee on Responsible Use of Artificial Intelligence; and for
2 other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, artificial intelligence systems are rapidly evolving and becoming increasingly
4 integrated into everyday services used by Georgia residents. Such systems have the potential
5 to drive innovation, support economic development, and improve productivity across many
6 sectors of Georgia's economy; and

7 WHEREAS, artificial intelligence systems are increasingly used in applications providing
8 advice or guidance to users, including minors seeking information, emotional support, or
9 assistance; and

10 WHEREAS, artificial intelligence systems also offer opportunities to improve the efficiency
11 and effectiveness of state government operations when implemented responsibly; and

12 WHEREAS, concerns remain that certain artificial intelligence systems may provide
13 harmful, misleading, or inappropriate advice to vulnerable individuals, including minors.
14 Such systems may also be used by government agencies or departments to assist in

15 decision-making processes that affect residents, raising important questions regarding
16 transparency, accountability, and the role of human judgment; and

17 WHEREAS, thoughtful public policy can help ensure that artificial intelligence systems are
18 used responsibly while preserving innovation and economic opportunity.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

20 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
21 on Responsible Use of Artificial Intelligence.

22 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of five members of the
23 House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
24 Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the committee as chairperson
25 of the committee.

26 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
27 issues, and problems including, but not limited to:

28 (A) The potential risk posed by artificial intelligence systems that provide advice or
29 information to minors;

30 (B) The use of artificial intelligence systems by state agencies or departments in
31 decisions affecting Georgia residents;

32 (C) Appropriate standards for transparency and human review in artificial intelligence
33 assisted decision-making;

34 (D) Opportunities for artificial intelligence systems to improve government efficiency
35 and service delivery;

36 (E) The role of artificial intelligence systems in economic development, workforce
37 readiness, and innovation in Georgia; and

38 (F) Potential legislative or regulatory approaches to promote the responsible use of
39 artificial intelligence systems.

40 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
41 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
42 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
43 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

44 (5) **Allowances and funding.**

45 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
46 for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.

47 (B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
48 of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds
49 necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
50 appropriated to the House of Representatives.

51 (6) **Report.**

52 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
53 include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
54 same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
55 subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

56 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
57 proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
58 of this paragraph.

59 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
60 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
61 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
62 the Clerk of the House of Representatives.

63 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the
64 House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu
65 thereof.

66 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2026.

67 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
68 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
69 public and press.
