A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Mamie G. Jones; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper to recognize and celebrate the life of citizens whose
3 dedication to faith, family, service, and community has left a lasting impact on all who knew
4 them; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Mamie G. Jones was born on August 2, 1940, in Gadsden County, Florida, to
6 Goldie and John Spencer Harrison, and from an early age, she was nurtured in a Christian
7 home grounded in faith, compassion, and service to others; and
- 8 WHEREAS, she joined Hopewell A.M.E. Church, where she faithfully served throughout
9 her life and demonstrated unwavering commitment to her church and community; and
- 10 WHEREAS, during her years of service at Hopewell A.M.E. Church, Mamie G. Jones
11 exemplified leadership and devotion, serving as a member of the Trustee Board, President
12 of the Graveyard Committee, Secretary of the Quincy District Lay Organization, Secretary
13 of the Florida Conference of Lay Organizations, and Director of Lay Activities of the Quincy
14 District; and

15 WHEREAS, Mamie G. Jones was a proud graduate of Carter-Parramore High School in
16 Quincy, Florida, Class of 1959, and she carried forward the values of education,
17 perseverance, and service throughout her life; and

18 WHEREAS, she dedicated many years of professional service to Florida A&M University,
19 working on the clerical and housing staff, where she assisted and supported thousands of
20 students, demonstrating kindness, professionalism, and a genuine care for others; and

21 WHEREAS, she was a woman known for her generosity, warmth, and unwavering
22 commitment to others, always putting the needs of family, friends, and community before
23 her own and leaving a lasting impression on everyone she encountered; and

24 WHEREAS, Mamie G. Jones departed this life on July 25, 1992, after a lengthy illness,
25 leaving behind a legacy of love, faith, and service that continues to inspire those who knew
26 and loved her; and

27 WHEREAS, she leaves to cherish her memory two loving daughters, Sandra G. Scott of
28 Savannah, Georgia, and Evelyn G. Faison of Havana, Florida; grandsons, Dexter X. Scott,
29 Savannah, and Quantarious "Chucky" Faison; son-in-law, Edward J. Scott; sisters, Mattie
30 Grice, Letha Harrison, and Bessie Manuel; brother-in-law, Lawrence Carl Grice; and a host
31 of cousins, godchildren, nieces, nephews, and many friends whose lives were blessed by her
32 presence; and

33 WHEREAS, the life of Mamie G. Jones stands as a shining example of faith, devotion, and
34 servant leadership, and her memory remains a source of strength and inspiration to her family
