A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and honoring Evelyn Wallace Johnson Camp on the occasion of her 100th
2 birthday; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Evelyn Wallace Johnson Camp was born on June 22, 1926, in Chamblee,
4 Georgia, to Samuel Dobson Johnson and Maude Gertrude Wallace, and she is the youngest
5 of their four children; and

6 WHEREAS, she graduated from Chamblee High School as a member of the Class of 1944,
7 demonstrating early her commitment to diligence and perseverance; and

8 WHEREAS, she married her high school sweetheart, Len Hoshall Camp, on October 26,
9 1944, at Prospect Methodist Church in Chamblee on the eve of his military service during
10 World War II, beginning a remarkable marriage that endured for 76 years; and

11 WHEREAS, as a young war bride, she traveled to California during World War II,
12 embracing new experiences and challenges with resilience and grace; and

13 WHEREAS, she is the devoted mother of Mary Lynn Camp Patrick and Mark Paul Camp,
14 and she has dedicated her life to building a loving home where family, hospitality, and shared
15 meals have always been central; and

16 WHEREAS, in addition to her roles as a wife and mother, Mrs. Camp contributed
17 meaningfully to the workforce, serving with the United States Army Corps of Engineers,
18 South Atlantic Division, in the Electrical Section as support staff, working alongside her
19 husband in their family business, Kleen Rite Cleaners, and later retiring from *McFadden*
20 *Business Publications*; and

21 WHEREAS, during her retirement years, she and her husband traveled extensively across the
22 United States in their motorhomes, embracing the beauty and diversity of this great nation;

24 WHEREAS, in 2000, she and her husband relocated to Fines Creek, North Carolina, where
25 they lived for 17 years before returning to Georgia; and

26 WHEREAS, she now resides on her family farm in Concord, Georgia, where she enjoys the
27 peace and beauty of rural life; and

28 WHEREAS, her century of life stands as a testament to faith, family, hard work, and
29 unwavering devotion to those she loves.

30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
31 the members of this body recognize and honor Evelyn Wallace Johnson Camp on the joyous
32 occasion of her 100th birthday and commend her for a life richly lived and for the lasting
