

WITHDRAWN

Senators Jackson of the 41st and Parent of the 44th offered the following amendment #2:

1 *Amend HB 295 (LC 63 0070S) by inserting after "immunity;" on line 9 the following:*

2 to amend Chapter 18 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state
3 printing and documents, so as to provide for public disclosure of certain documents; to
4 provide for an effective date;

5 *By inserting after line 135 the following:*

6 Chapter 18 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to state printing
7 and documents, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

8 "50-18-79.

9 (a) If any claim of an unlawful employment practice made against the General Assembly,
10 the House of Representatives, the Senate, or any member, office, or employee thereof,
11 including, but not limited to, a claim of sexual harassment, discriminatory harassment,
12 discrimination, or retaliation, is resolved in whole or in part by a settlement agreement, a
13 memorandum of agreement or understanding, or other similar document, however
14 denominated, such agreement shall be subject to public disclosure with the claimant's
15 identity redacted. For purposes of this subsection exclusively, the General Assembly shall
16 be an agency. This subsection shall be applied retroactively.

17 (b) Except as provided for in subsection (a) of this Code section, nothing in this Code
18 section shall be construed or applied so as to subject the General Assembly to the
19 provisions of Code Sections 50-18-70 through 50-18-78 or Chapter 14 of this title."

SECTION 3.

21 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the governor or upon its becoming law
22 without such approval.
